- Pretend you are a reporter and tell me about what you read.
- Draw a comic about what you read today.
- What 3 things do you like best about what you read?
- If you could ask a person in this story anything, what would it be?
- What is your favorite scene in this story?
- Pretend you are a teacher and make a quiz with 5 questions about what you read.
- Describe a problem in the story and how it was solved. Would you have solved it the same way?

narration IDEAS

- Tell me what you wish would happen next in the story.
- What are your favorite words from your reading today?
- Write a newspaper article about what you read today. Design the front page of a paper and put your story on it, including a headline!
- Create a diary entry from the person's point of view that you read about today.
- Write a poem about your reading today.
- Write a letter from one character to another one.
- Write a book review.
 How many stars would you give this book?
 Why?

narration IDEAS

- Draw a picture of your favorite scene or moment from your story.
- Write a short skit about your story.
 (Bonus: perform it for your family and/or friends!)
- Describe how you would make this chapter or book into a movie.
- Use clay to make the scene and characters of the story. (Bonus: make a video or stop motion of the story with your creation!)
- Record a news broadcast, summarizing what you read in your story today.
- Design a theme park around what you know about the characters, time period, etc. of your story.
